## Wayne County to Assist with Annual Ecorse Creek Cleanup

**DETROIT – May 15** Wayne County's Department of Environment will be assisting with the annual Ecorse Creek Cleanup on Saturday, May 20, 2006 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Clean up and streambank restoration efforts are being held at five locations throughout the Ecorse Creek watershed, sponsored by the all-volunteer Downriver Stream Team. Wayne County Department of Environment's Facilities Management Division crews will do their part by removing large log and debris jams along the creek, providing assistance to the volunteer effort.

The cleanup projects will take place in Dearborn Heights, Ecorse, Lincoln Park, Romulus, Westland and Wyandotte. Picnic lunches, equipment, and gloves will be provided for volunteers.
