The Michigan Department of Community Health announces a new TBI web-based training, funded in part by the Health Resources and Services Administration, Maternal and Child Health Bureau. The training, specifically targeted to staff at Michigan's public service agencies, provides basic clinical information about TBI and treatment strategies, and recommends the use of a basic screening tool.

**The curriculum** consists of four modules requiring 30 to 45 minutes each to complete:

- Significance of TBI and introductory information on how the brain works
- Common physical, behavioral and cognitive impairments and interaction strategies
- Screening for a history of TBI
- Public services available for eligible persons with TBI

State board continuing education credits will soon be offered for completion of the online TBI training. Credits will be available toward the following professional licenses: Education, Nursing, and Social Work.
